By signing in and accessing QMUL IT services you agree to comply with all QMUL IT related policies and procedures, and to any additions and amendments made to them from time to time. To view, visit: www.arcs.qmul.ac.uk/policy

Your QMUL username is unique to you. Remember to keep your password private and do not leave your computer unattended. Either lock or sign out of the computer as you are responsible for any inappropriate actions traced to your account.

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Connect to Wi-Fi on campus

QMUL's Wi-Fi network is called 'eduroam'.

The eduroam service provides internet access not only in QMUL but in academic institutions across the UK and in 50 countries around the world with the same QMUL username and password.

When connecting to the eduroam network, your Wi-Fi username is your QMUL username followed by @qmul.ac.uk (ie ab12345@qmul.ac.uk)

Apple, Windows and latest Android devices

Select the 'eduroam' network in your Wi-Fi settings. This will prompt you for your username and password. You will need to enter your QMUL username in the format **ab12345@qmul.ac.uk** (please note that this is NOT your email address). You will then be asked to accept a certificate – please say yes to this.

Other devices / manual set-up

If your device cannot automatically connect to the 'eduroam' wireless network you can try the manual setup. If you already have access to a 3G / 4G or an alternative wireless connection, instructions for manually downloading the certificate and connecting your device to 'eduroam' are available, visit: www.its.qmul.ac.uk/support/self-help/WiFi

Open a browser, visit: <http://www.its.qmul.ac.uk/support/self-help/WiFi/index.html> and download the 'Network Support Root Certificate (PEM)' – save it as QMUL CA. Then connect to the 'eduroam' wireless network using the following settings:

- AP Method = PEAP
- Phase 2 authentication = MSCHAPV2
- CA certificate = Specified (setting not on all devices)
- User certificate = Unspecified (setting not on all devices)
- Identity = **username@qmul.ac.uk** (eg **ab12345@qmul.ac.uk**)
- Anonymous identity = none@qmul.ac.uk

If this does not work please contact IT Services.

Computers on campus

QMUL provides computers across all campuses and within all QMUL libraries. Some of the computer labs are scheduled for teaching, however students can use the room when teaching is not in progress. The computers available in QMUL libraries are not used for teaching.

In general, any computer you use on campus should have all the applications you need for your course work. There are some exceptions for more specialist software, particularly in Computer Science, Economics and Engineering. Your school will let you know where to find any specialist software that you need.

Using QMUL computers on campus

Sign out: Please remember to sign out when you have finished with the computer. If you forget, the computer will automatically sign you out after 45 minutes of inactivity, but other students might be waiting to use it.

Lock it: If you have to walk away from the computer for a few minutes, it is important to lock the computer in order to protect your work and prevent others using your account or signing you out and losing your work.

Forgot something? Don't forget to take your USB memory stick, hard drive and other belongings with you. If you leave it behind, check at a Library Welcome Desk or Security to see if someone has handed it in.

Email

QMUL supplies all students with a university email address. This will be the address which the university, including your lecturers and tutors, will normally use to communicate with you. You can check your email from a phone, tablet or computer so you can always access your mail from anywhere with an internet connection.

To sign in you will need your QMUL username (eg ab12345) and password. The general format for your student email address is: initial.name@facyy.qmul.ac.uk

- 'fac' is the code for the Faculty in which you are registered
- 'yy' is the year you started the course
- If you have a middle name your initials will be separated by a full stop (eg j.h.smith@hss15.qmul.ac.uk)

QMplus

QMplus is the university's online learning environment and is used by your school to provide detailed information about your course and specific modules. Many schools require you to submit your work electronically through QMplus so make sure you are familiar with the site.

You can sign in to QMplus from a phone, tablet or computer so you can always access your content from anywhere with an internet connection.

You can also view your timetable through QMplus once it has been published by your school. If you get an 'Error finding timetable' message, contact your school to find out when it will be published.

MySIS

The university keeps your student record on a system called MySIS. This system is used by students to enrol, register for modules, view exam timetables, view past and provisional results and to keep your personal information up to date.

MySIS is owned by the university's Academic Registry and Council Secretariat (ARCS) and they are your first point of contact for assistance with MySIS. For more information about your MySIS record, visit: www.arcs.qmul.ac.uk/students/mysis-record

Q-Review

Q-Review is a service set up in some lecture theatres that records live lectures and teaching materials. Presenters can choose to record their lectures and make them available in QMplus, so you can view the content from a phone, tablet or from anywhere with an internet connection.

QMUL app

QMUL's app is available for Android and iOS devices, all you need to do is search for 'QMUL' in your app store. Once installed you will have access to a wide range of QMUL, local and transport information and IT services through a single interface from your device.

iPay account

Printing, copying and library fines are paid by using your iPay account, which is linked to your student ID card. When you join QMUL a complimentary £4 of printing credit will be added to your iPay account. As well as topping up your account using cash kiosks located in each of the Libraries at Mile End and Whitechapel you can top-up, check your balance and your account history online, by visiting:

Print, copy and scan

QMUL has a wireless printing service. You can upload your documents to a QMUL printer from a phone, tablet or from anywhere with an internet connection. To access the wireless printing service, visit: <https://eprint.stu.qmul.ac.uk>, and sign in with your QMUL username and password.

Alternatively you can sign in to a QMUL computer on campus and print from there. You can collect documents you have sent to be printed at any printer within 24 hours. All you need to do is swipe your student ID card at the terminal and choose which document(s) you would like to print.

OneDrive

OneDrive allows you to store all your files in one location in Microsoft's cloud environment, with the ability to access your files from a phone, tablet, computer or from anywhere with an internet connection.
